
Did you know that

What is it about?

Making it easier for adults with learning disabilities to have their eyes checked



Why?

Everyone should be able to get good sight tests when they need them.

It is important to have healthy eyes.

It helps people see well and do things for themselves as much as they can.




Is it for me?



If you are an adult with learning disabilities living in Wokingham.



If you have not had a sight test in the last 2 years or you are looking for an optician.



Here is what to do:



- 1. Pick one of the opticians from the list on the back page**
They have had special training in working with people with learning disabilities.



- 2. Get in touch with the optician to book an appointment**
Make sure you say it is for a person with a learning disability



- 3. Fill in the form 'Telling the optometrist about me'**

Optometrist is another word for optician.


